Morgan Stanley Extends "Building the TOMODACHI Generation" Program

"Morgan Stanley Ambassadors Program" to Continue Developing Next Generation of Leaders

TOKYO - Morgan Stanley Japan Holdings Co., Ltd. today announced that it and the TOMODACHI Initiative, a public-private partnership between the U.S.-Japan Council and the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo, will extend their partnership to invest in the next generation of leaders in the two countries through the "Building the TOMODACHI Generation" program.
